In extreme cases, it might be necessary to take out your tools and disassemble these plumbing devices to really dig and remove all the gunk. Most of the time, however, faucets and shower heads can be cleaned without removing them, using some common household items. Handyman FamilyHow to clean shower heads and faucets with vinegarHere's what you need: Here's the step-by-step process: Fill a plastic bag about halfway with vinegar. Use quarter-size for faucets and gallon-sized for shower heads. (If you have a large shower head, you may need to be creative.) Wrap the vinegar-filled bag around the shower head or faucet so that any place where the water comes out is completely immersed in vinegar. Hold the bag in place by slamming a rubber band around it, placing it on the shower head or faucet. Wait about an hour to let vinegar eat away at hard water deposits or calcium build-ups. After the hour, remove the bag and rub the faucet or shower head with a toothbrush to clear any stubborn residue. Run the water like a final rinse. If you turn on the shower and individual spray holes in the shower head are always blocked, trying to sting them with a small tool like a toothpick. The vinegar will loosen any build-up so that it can be easily dislodged. Handyman FamilyHow to Clean Taps With a LemonIf you don't have vinegar at your fingertips or prefer a more natural solution, try this: Cut a fresh lemon in half. With one of the halves, use your thumbs to gently open the center. Press the lemon on the tip of the tap. Put a small plastic bag around the lemon and attach it around the faucet with an elastic. Make sure the elastic is tight and the lemon covers the end of the faucet. Leave the lemon in place for a few hours to allow citric acid to work its magic. After removing the lemon, use a gentle cleaning pad or toothbrush to wash off any accumulation of hard, released water. Wipe the faucet with a moist to remove leftover lemon juice, and your faucet will squeak clean. On a clean-up kick?
